Summary:	The plaintiff suffered a premature fracture of a component of the artificial hip supplied by the defendants. He sought certification of a class proceeding representing members who had similar fractures.
Issue:	Should the proceeding be certified under the <i>Class Proceedings Act</i> ?
Result:	The Court was satisfied that the certification should be granted on the evidence presented. The application of the <i>Sale of Goods Act</i> was not found to be a common issue. Quantification of punitive damages, if any, was deferred until after assessment of individual damages. A small class was not an impediment to certification on a national basis.
