Summary: The Supreme Court allowed a lessor's appeal from a decision

of a Small Claims Court adjudicator on a residential tenancies matter. The lessee filed a notice of appeal to the Court of Appeal. The lessor moved for an order to dismiss the appeal.

Issues: Does the Court of Appeal have jurisdiction to hear a further

appeal from the Supreme Court after an appeal from the Small

Claims Court in a residential tenancies dispute?

Result: The Court of Appeal granted the motion and dismissed the

appeal. Section 32(6) of the *Small Claims Court Act* says that a decision of the Supreme Court pursuant to s. 32 "is final and not subject to appeal". As the Decision of the Supreme Court in this matter was pursuant to s. 32, s. 32(6) precluded a

further appeal to the Court of Appeal. The Court of Appeal's appellate authority over taxations of legal costs and lawyers'

fees did not apply to this residential tenancies matter.
