**SUBJECT:****STAY OF EXECUTION - Application pursuant to Civil Procedure Rule 62.10****SUMMARY:**

A judge of the Supreme Court ordered judgment against two of the appellants in favour of the respondents. The judge also ordered that one of the appellants should transfer a fishing license to one of the respondents within three days from the date of the order.

**ISSUE:**

Whether it was just that an application for a stay be granted in the circumstances.

**RESULT:**

The Chambers judge reviewed the principles governing the granting of a stay of execution, reviewed the evidence presented in affidavit form, and the submissions of the parties. The application for a stay was dismissed with costs.
