SUBJECT: SENTENCING: CONDITIONAL SENTENCES - COUNSELLING

MURDER

SUMMARY: The respondent was found guilty of counselling the offence of murder, which

offence was not committed, contrary to s. 464(a) of the **Criminal Code** and was sentenced to two years less a day, to be served as a conditional sentence,

in the community and subject to conditions, followed by three years

probation. The Crown appealed the sentence.

ISSUES: Whether the two years less a day was adequate considering the circumstances

of the offence, and whether the reasons were adequate.

RESULT: Appeal dismissed. Given the circumstances of the offender and the offence,

the sentence, while at the very low end of an acceptable range, was not demonstrably unfit. In view of the record before the court, the reasons were

adequate.
