collision in which she suffered a mild lumbar sprain. He found that the motor vehicle accident did not materially contribute to any of the serious mental and physical difficulties from which she suffered. General non-pecuniary damages were assessed

at \$15,000.

**ISSUES:** Whether the trial judge erred in making findings of fact or

erred in law in apportioning liability, determining causation

and assessment of damages.

**RESULT:** Appeal and cross-appeal dismissed. There was sufficient

evidence to support the findings of fact and conclusions of the

trial judge. No error of law.
