Result: Appeal dismissed. The judge did not err in finding the

implement used by the offender was a weapon or in assessing the credibility and reliability of the Crown witnesses. The record indicates his trial counsel conducted his defence

appropriately. His sentence was not demonstrably unfit given,

among other things, his substantial criminal record.
