SUMMARY: The appellant was convicted in Provincial Court of trafficking in cocaine and sentenced to three years incarceration.

ISSUES: Was the verdict unreasonable?
Was the sentence unfit?

RESULT: Conviction appeal dismissed. The evidence of identification is sufficient and reasonably capable of supporting the conviction. Sentence appeal dismissed. In consideration of the appellant's lengthy criminal record the sentence was fit.
