SUBJECT: Town Planning Act - use of development agreement

SUMMARY: The Town of Truro after completing all preliminary procedures and a

public hearing approved a development agreement permitting the building of an apartment building in a R-7 zone. An appeal by local residents to the Utilities and Review Board resulted in the matter being referred back

to Town Council for further review.

ISSUE: Whether the Board was correct in holding that the Town had not followed

its Municipal Planning Strategy in approving the agreement.

<u>RESULT</u>: The Appeal Court held that the Board was wrong in concluding that the Town had not reasonably followed its Municipal Planning Strategy and referring the matter back for further consideration. The decision of the Town Council was

confirmed.
