SUBJECT: **CRIMINAL LAW - Sentence - False Pretences - Code s. 362(1)(a)**

SUMMARY: Appellant, 28 years old, with twelve priors, pled guilty that by false pretence with intent he defrauded a car dealership and obtained a 1996 Dodge van of a value exceeding \$5,000.00. He was represented by counsel at sentencing. He was sentenced to eight months imprisonment to be followed by two years probation.

ISSUE: He appealed alleging that his presentence report was misleading; that his counsel did not adequately bring the errors to the attention of the trial judge; that the trial judge was not adequately informed of the reasons for his change of plea from not guilty to guilty, and that his counsel did not represent him to the best of her ability.

RESULT: While granting leave to appeal, the Court dismissed the appeal. After reviewing the record and hearing submissions, the Court concluded that the trial judge neither erred in law nor imposed an excessive or erroneous sentence.
