**SUMMARY**: The appellants, a journalist and a newspaper, appealed from the

chambers judge's decision where he dismissed their application to strike the respondents' defamation claim as not disclosing a cause of action. The appellants argued that because the two respondents,

both youth workers at the Shelburne School for Boys, had

consented to appearing on the television program *The Fifth Estate*, they were precluded from recovering damages for defamation.

**HELD:** Appeal dismissed. The respondents' consent to appearing on that

nationally broadcast television program did not amount to a license or consent to the appellants to publish whatever they chose. Costs

of \$1,500.00, payable to the respondents forthwith.
