Subject:	Validity of a regulation under the Dairy Industry Act
Summary:	The <i>Dairy Industry Act</i> , S.N.S. 2000, c. 24 authorized regulations that govern the "terms and conditions on which the transfer [of production quota] may take place". Regulation 21 of the <i>Total Production Quota Regulations</i> under the <i>Dairy Industry Act</i> prescribed a cap on the price for the transfer of production quota between dairy farmers. The appellants, dairy farmers with quota, sought an order that Regulation 21 was <i>ultra vires</i> . The Supreme Court of Nova Scotia dismissed the claim. The appellants appealed to the Court of Appeal.
Issue:	Is Regulation 21 of the <i>Total Production Quota Regulations</i> <i>ultra vires</i> the enabling provisions of the <i>Dairy Industry Act</i> ?

Result: The Court of Appeal dismissed the appeal. The price to be paid for quota was one of the "terms and conditions" of transfer within the enabling provision of the *Dairy Industry Act*. Regulation 21 is intra vires.
