**Summary:** The trial judge found HRM liable to the respondent in nuisance

and awarded damages to the respondent for a period of 19 years. HRM appealed alleging the trial judge failed to properly consider the utility of conduct; failed to properly interpret both the defences of statutory immunity and statutory authority and erred in awarding damages for the full 19 year period, arguing that damages should be assessed only for the period after HRM

received notice.

**Issue:** Did the trial judge err as alleged by HRM?

**Result:** Appeal dismissed. The trial judgment was varied to reflect the

appropriate calculation of pre-judgment interest on the damage

award.
