Issues: Whether the appellant had demonstrated that the conduct or

omissions amounted to incompetence and that the incompetence had resulted in a miscarriage of justice.

Result: Appeal dismissed. Nothing that the appellant complains that

his trial counsel did, or did not do, resulted in any prejudice to

him. Nothing in the record suggested that the lawyer's preparation, or performance, fell outside the range of

reasonable, professional conduct.
