- SUBJECT: Divorce; Spousal support; Variation
- **SUMMARY:** An interim order from Alberta, later confirmed in Nova Scotia, provided spousal support of \$1,000 a month to the appellant husband for a term which expired February 1, 1998, or until he became employed or received a disability pension. He now receives a Canada disability pension of about \$812.00 a month, which he claims is inadequate. The wife, a hotel executive, earns \$60,000 a year. She has custody of the two children of the marriage. The appeal is from dismissal of an application to vary the interim order on the ground that the appellant failed to show a material change in circumstances.
- **ISSUES**: Did the Chambers judge err in finding circumstances had not changed materially since the interim order was granted?
- **RESULT:** The appeal was dismissed with costs of \$500.00 plus disbursements. There had been no material change in circumstances.
