Summary: The appellant appealed the motions judge's decision which

summarily dismissed its claim that the respondent had committed the tort of unlawful means against it. Shortly before its appeal was heard, the Supreme Court of Canada issued a decision which clarified certain aspects of the law

pertaining to that tort.

Issues: Whether the judge relied on an element of the tort which is no

longer required.

Result: Appeal allowed and the Statement of Claim reinstated. The

judge's decision turned on an element which has been removed by recent jurisprudence. In the result, he erred in law. Since the law pertaining to that tort was unsettled, no

costs were awarded.
