ISSUES: 1. The appropriate standard of review.

2. Did the Discipline Panel commit reversible error?

RESULT:

- 1. The appropriate standard for all issues under review is reasonableness.
- 2. Appeal allowed in part. Aside from one discrete aspect of the Panel's disposition, its inclusions were reasonable.
