**Subject:** Costs: New Tariff; Tariff vrs. Lump Sum

**Summary:** Karela recovered \$6,000 general damages and \$9,000 aggravated damages from

CTV.

**Issues:** Whether new or old Tariff applies? Whether lump sum costs are appropriate?

**Result:** Except for the Chambers Tariff, the new Tariff applies only to costs where action

was commenced after 29 September 2003. The old Tariff would be inadequate in this case. Although damages were only \$15,000, the jury's findings were necessary to vindication against a defamatory broadcast, which the jury found to have been reckless. The broadcaster should contribute substantially to cost of vindication. A

lump sum of \$25,000 is ordered.
