Subject: Sentencing for trafficking in crack cocaine.

Summary: Accused was a middle man in the sale of 50 grams of crack to a police agent.

Accused was not a target of the undercover operation but was used as a means of

getting to a named target.

Issue: Whether conditional sentence an appropriate penalty.

Result: Conditional sentence of 2 years less 1 day imposed. The normal range for such

offence is 3-5 years barring exceptional circumstances. In this case the accused had been under release provisions amounting to house arrest for 2½ years prior to sentencing without incident. The deprivation of his liberty while on bail together

with his minor role in the transaction constituted exceptional circumstances

similar to those in R. V. Messervey.
