**Facts:** Plaintiff had tried to pass Defendant on the right side as the

Defendant slowed to execute a left-hand turn. Plaintiff's right wheels caught the edge of the ditch and Plaintiff's vehicle rolled on its side into a tree. Plaintiff claimed Defendant had stopped in travel lane thereby creating a dangerous situation.

**Result:** Plaintiff's case dismissed. Defendant's vehicle had not stopped

but was in process of properly executing a left-hand turn. Accident caused by Plaintiff's lack of care and attention. Plaintiff either travelling too fast or Plaintiff impatient. If driving properly, Plaintiff should have been able to avoid

accident by simply stopping his vehicle.
