Summary: The appellant did not yield and drove through a crosswalk where a pedestrian

signal was flashing, in the circumstance where the pedestrian stepped off a boulevard three lanes away. The appellant claimed a sudden stop would have

resulted in a collision by a vehicle from behind.

Result: The adjudicator erred in failing to consider the defence of *due diligence* and

appeared to treat the offence as one of absolute liability. The matter was returned

to Provincial Court for a new hearing
