**Summary:** Ms. Peach sought a copy of a letter from a Department of Justice

lawyer to a Department of Transportation official. The official had summarized the contents in a communication to a municipality. The

government refused disclosure under s. 16 about privilege.

**Issues:** (1) Whether the summary amounted to waiver? (2) Whether the

official had authority to do so.

**Result:** Disclosure was required. The summary amounted to implied waiver.

The official produced the summary while acting within his duties. Authority to waive privilege comes with the authority to perform

those duties.
