and business income resulted from underemployment;

(3) Whether the Respondent was entitled to spousal support.

**Summary:** The parties were married for 14 years. The Petitioner, professional lawyer

and mediator, was represented by counsel. The Respondent was separately advised by two counsel between separation and this final hearing. She appeared unrepresented at the hearing. The Divorce hearing proceeded based largely on the affidavit evidence and disclosure provided by the

Petitioner.

**Result:** Equal division of property and debts.

Child support awarded on current income.

Continuing Order to disclose relating to professional, personal and

corporate tax disclosure relating to the parties.
